local treasures SEAGLASS

Observant beachgoers can often find bright bits of glass, churned and smoothed by tide and sand into bits of lovely seaglass. Luminous, pastel hued, white, blue, green and brown bits come from bottles. Occasional bits of antique porcelain or pottery can also be found. Most prized is the deep red glass, fragments of a boat's red port lights. Check out Local Colors Artisans Coop and downtown boutiques for beautiful seaglass jewelry and decorative accessories.

Storms or exceptionally high tides often yield rich finds of seaglass. Rocky beaches, like downtown's Pavilion Beach, are favorite local hunting grounds.



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Our Lady of Good Voyage Church on Prospect Street, with its twin blue spires gracing the hill above the waterfront, houses a 31 bell carillon, the oldest in the United States. In between the spires is a statue of our Lady holding a fishing vessel. The original statue is in the Cape Ann Museum on Pleasant Street.
