Discover the Cape Ann Museum



Fitz Henry Lane, *Stage Rocks and the Western Shore of Gloucester Outer Harbor, 1857*

Cape Ann is a singular place.

Harbors, rocky coves and salt marches outline its edges and granite ledge stretches to the interior. The area's natural beauty and engaging industrial activity nurtured America's first and greatest summer art colony. The striking light and dynamic relationship between land and water still draws people- for a day trip, for a summer vacation, and for a way of life. Founded in 1873, the Cape Ann Museum collects and exhibits the art produced here, interprets the history that shaped it, and narrates the economic and social forces that define it.

Discover the Art.

The Museum owns the preeminent collection of paintings and drawings by American maritime artist and Gloucester born, Fitz Henry Lane (1804-1865), as well as works by other late 19th and early 20th century painters connected with Cape Ann – John Sloan, Stuart Davis, Marsden Hartley, and Milton Avery, among them. Works by Cape Ann sculptors Walker Hancock, Paul Manship, Anna Hyatt Huntington and Katherine Lane Weems are also part of the permanent collection. A landscaped sculpture garden, lined with Cape Ann granite, displays works from the Museum's collection.

The Museum also houses the largest collection of the Folly Cove Designers, a guild of textile designer-craftsmen who worked from 1941 until 1969 (see photo at left).

Discover the History.

The maritime and fishing collections reflect Cape Ann's preeminence in seafaring pursuits. Two galleries dedicated
