the wooden schooners of the last century to present day steel and fiberglass vessels. Be sure to get down to the end of the Neck to see for yourself how ships are brought onto land.

The highly visible red buildings at the entry to the harbor belonged to the former Tarr & Wonson Paint Manufactory, built in 1863. The copper bottom paint they invented prevented ship hulls from fouling with barnacles and infestation from worms which damage hulls and slow their speeds. The factory will soon have a new life as an oceanographic research center.

Walk down narrow Horton Street to view Gloucester Harbor much as it's been seen for centuries. You may encounter a plein air student or two painting a maritime scene as artists the likes of Childe Hassam, Charles Gruppe, Frederic Mulhaupt, Stuart Davis and many others have done.

Rocky Neck Art Colony, begun in the early 1800's, is the nation's oldest artist colony. Artists of all sorts flourish here, drawn to the beautiful scenery and marvelous light. Many studios are open to the public. Don't miss the many galleries selling paintings, sculpture, jewelry, textile art and more.

Take a break and enjoy a dockside dinner. Listen to live jazz, rock and acoustic performers in venues along the Neck (*first Thursday each month, May-October, 5 to 9pm*). Looking for drama?
